Dear Parent/Carer

We are almost at the start of the new academic year and I look forward to having your children back in school soon.

Those of you who live close to the school will have noticed the rapid progress of the new Art/DT building. The basic structure is now in place and work is proceeding rapidly. We are on course to open the building in mid-November and are really looking forward to the increased educational options it will bring.

Today our Class of 2023 collected their examination results amid great celebration – we really are very proud of them all.

As always in Ash Manor School, the biggest impact we see is due to the attendance of the students.

It is important that you are aware of the following data from Ash Manor School's Class of 2023:

- Attendance of 95% or above
 - In English, 43% gained a grade 7 or better, 93% gained a grade 5 or better and 98% gained a grade 4 or better
 - In Maths, 40% gained a grade 7 or better, 78% gained a grade 5 or better and 98% gained a grade 4 or better
 - The average grade for all exams was a grade 6
- Attendance from 90 – 95%
 - In English, 25% gained a grade 7 or better, 75% gained a grade 5 or better and 89% gained a grade 4 or better
 - In Maths, 31% gained a grade 7 or better, 68% gained a grade 5 or better and 85% gained a grade 4 or better
 - The average grade for all exams was a grade 5
- Attendance less than 90%
 - In English, 6% gained a grade 7 or better, 45% gained a grade 5 or better and 60% gained a grade 4 or better
 - In Maths, 8% gained a grade 7 or better, 34% gained a grade 5 or better and 50% gained a grade 4 or better
 - The average grade for all exams was a grade 3

These figures exemplify how very vital excellent attendance is, so I implore all of you to work with us to maximise your child's attendance and hence support them to make the very best progress possible.

School begins on Tuesday 5th September at 8:40am and students will start in their tutor rooms. The tutor group assignment is attached to this letter.

There will be a range of extra-curricular clubs starting again in September and I encourage all students to get involved in some of these activities. In addition, there will be opportunities for Year 11 after school study and support and I hope that your child will find these helpful.

The uniform guidelines have been sent along with this letter and I ask that you check these carefully to ensure that any item you buy complies with school requirements. In particular, please be aware of the need to comply with the regulations concerning piercings, nails and hair colours to ensure that we get the new school year off to a positive start with everyone.

I have listed some key dates so that you can get these in your diary now.

There will be some changes in the discipline policy from September that I would like to make you aware of ahead of the new term.

Firstly, we have simplified the detention system. Most parents will feel no impact as the great majority of our students rarely have to do a detention. However, sanctions are required to ensure that we operate an effective school and we are moving to a centralised detention system, with all detentions to be done on the day following the issue of the behaviour point. Each detention will be one hour long and if a student receives two behaviour points in a single day, which very few children do, then they will be required to complete a 2 hour detention the following day. All detentions will be on the Satchel One app so that you can adjust any arrangements to collect your child on the rare occasion that they have to complete a detention.

We also require every student to have the appropriate equipment for school and there will be regular checks made in tutor time. If a student does not have the correct equipment then a behaviour point and a detention will be issued. The equipment list is attached to this letter and some school supplies can be purchased at student reception if they are needed. In particular I ask that you note that every student must have a school bag to enable them to bring the required books and equipment to school. Since everyone should have access to their Knowledge Organiser in every class, a school bag is imperative. Within the school bag, we also recommend every student has a refillable water bottle to enable them to easily stay hydrated throughout the day.

We will continue to operate a loan system for the few occasions that a student does not have the correct uniform, but there will be sanctions applied to the small number of students who persistently come to school without their full uniform. If there is an issue with the uniform at home, please contact your child's Head of House so that we can assist you to resolve the problem and prevent a sanction being applied.



Uniform	PE Kit
<p>The following items of uniform are compulsory:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blazer (Black with blue braid and Ash Manor logo) only available from the official school suppliers • Long or short sleeve blue shirt, must be tucked in and done up to the collar • House tie only available from the official school suppliers • Polishable back shoes (heels not exceeding 5cm) • Black socks, must be below the knee or black opaque tights (not patterned) – socks or tights must always be worn <p>Students must choose from the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Black trousers with AMS embroidery only available from the official school suppliers • Black skirt with AMS embroidery only available from the official school suppliers • Black shorts with AMS embroidery only available from the official school suppliers <p>The following items are optional:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jumper (Black with blue trim) only available from the official school suppliers • Outdoor coat (no hoodies or tracksuit tops) • Plain black belt with plain, non-branded buckle • Sports trainers (only to be worn for PE lessons or for games activities at break-times only) 	<p>The following items of PE kit are compulsory:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vapour polo shirt • Milan shorts • Sports Trainers / Football Boots • Coolmax Socks • Sports Trainers are required for all PE lessons and must be suitable for indoor as well as outdoor work. They must be of a design that offers proper support to the feet. Thin canvas footwear such as ‘Converse’ boots offer no support or protection and should not be worn. All trainers must be of a type that can be securely tied for safety • Football Boots – these need to have rounded plastic moulded students to be used on the 3G pitch (these can be worn for any activity on the 3G pitch) <p>The following items are optional:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shinpads are recommended to be worn for football • Gumshields are recommended to be worn for rugby • White sports socks (optional for summer term) • Falcon – Navy with white piping Training Tracksuit Bottoms (optional) • Falcon ¼ zip Navy and white piping Training Mid Layer (optional) • Cuatro Fleece (optional) • Skort (optional) • Skins/Baselayer or sports thermals (optional but recommended) • Pro-tec Rugby top (optional but recommended) • Towel (optional)
<p><u>Jewellery / Make-Up / Tattoos</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jewellery should not be worn in school, other than an inexpensive watch, one signet ring and one small stud in each lobe. 	

- Nose rings/studs, tongue studs, eye-brow studs or any visible body piercings are unacceptable
- No responsibility is accepted for jewellery which is lost or stolen and no jewellery can be worn during practical lessons and PE. The taping of earrings or other piercings is not permissible.
- Clear nail varnish only is acceptable. No false / acrylic / gel nails are permitted.
- Make up of any type should be natural and inconspicuous
- No tattoos are allowed in accordance with the Tattooing of Minors Act 1969

Hairstyles

- Hair has to be tied off the shoulders when required for safety reasons
- No extreme hairstyles-including lurid, unnatural or extreme colouring etc, are permitted
- Hair cuts should be suitable for a professional work environment
- No tramlines
- Hair accessories must be black •Hijabs must be black

Outdoor Weather

- Students should wear suitable outdoor wear in inclement weather • No hoodies or sweatshirts are permitted

Mobile Phones / Headphones

- Electronic devices, including mobile phones and headphones, etc., may only be used during non-lesson time, unless directed to do so by a teacher – items will be confiscated if used inappropriately. If items are brought into school, the school will not take the responsibility for their safety or security.
- Any confiscated student items can be collected at the end of the school day from the Finance Office
